Alex Valcarce opened up the online Zoom meeting at 9:30AM.

It was noted that the COA meeting agenda is full for this evening and NewCAL is not included.

With regard to the DRC meeting last Wednesday, 11/18, the DRC recognizes the historic value of the existing building although also recognizes inherent challenges. The general consensus was a

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new building would better meet the particular needs of the user group for this particular project. The goal of the DRC meeting was for the Committee to start thinking about building mass, height and siting, particular with regard to abutter adjacency, as well as parking and green space. The project will need to take into account integration with the Newtonville business district, to create connection with, and ease of access to, Newtonville amenities.

Highlights from DRC meeting feedback:

- Discussion was primarily between two new options: A 4-story bar building and an L-shaped 4-story/3-story building. There was a slight lean towards the L-shaped design as this layout may offer more opportunity for design innovation.
- Engagement with direct abutters was discussed. Abutters have attended community meetings to date and are aware and informed of the project. There will be more pointed communication with abutters as the design develops and the direction is more focused. It was noted that it is important for the neighbors to have an opportunity to express any concerns and ask questions, outside of a public meeting. It is important to meet with direct neighbors sooner rather than later to confirm that the neighbor's desires align with what the DRC believes the neighbors want.
- Another design option to consider may be a 4-story portion on the corner of Highland and Walnut with two 3-story wings stepping down on both sides. BH+A will explore this option.
- The allocation of green space shall be studied to determine which is better suited: green space as a buffer, with the building set back from Walnut Street or alternatively, more concentrated green space on the corner or as a courtyard. A suggestion was made for the building to push to the northeast and maximize green space to the south. This would provide an opportunity to replicate the current garden, at the south side. The garden could serve a dual function as a community space, perhaps connected to the café.
- Parking vs. green space need to be reviewed to determine level of importance.
- Drop off area (covered) needs to be incorporated.

Going forward, it was noted that all presentations should begin with an overview of milestones achieved since the meeting prior with that particular audience. It is important to remind folks about the journey and where the project is in the process.

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It was discussed that the next community update meeting should be scheduled in January, after meeting with Newton Historic on 12/17/20. Pending confirmation of the 1/20/21 PF/PS City Council meeting, a community update meeting will be scheduled, which will likely be 1/14/21.
