Josh Morse (Newton Public Buildings) opened up the online Zoom meeting at 9:30AM.

The intent of this meeting is to recap meetings which recently took place with the Community, Council on Aging and the City Council Public Facilities and Programs and Services. It was noted that based on



overwhelming support of the design progress to date, the project team is continuing to move forward with refining the design and continuing to take feedback from various committees and councils.

Meetings are scheduled with the Design Review Committee (DRC) on 10/13 at 6:00PM as well as with the Design Review Team (DRT) on 10/21 at 10:40AM.

Discussion was focused on reviewing various options to cover the large 2400SF third floor roof deck as well as review of updated floor flans. 3-D images were presented for the following roof coverage options:

- Solid roof outdoor room space below becomes integrated with building
 Concern noted that natural light into programming area may be diminished
- Solar panels free standing shading structure affords opportunity for additional solar panels
 Careful consideration will need to be given to column placement of columns, to not impact use of deck space. Sunlight would be filtered.
- Trellis structure creates visual interest and provides shading creates a semi-open space laser cut or steel

Trellis would provide shade while allowing light to filter through and into adjacent spaces. Columns will need to be carefully coordinated to not impact use of deck space.

Tensile canopy – visual interest – semi-permanent

Option to retract and expand should be studied. Can block sunlight. Allows for two-story option to be present along Walnut Street. Provides shade and natural light to enter the 3rd floor spaces.

Does not fit with building style.

Durability could be an issue during winter months.

All other options appear as three stories from Walnut Street. Canopy could add drama and interest.

Canopy could be powered or manually operated.

Concern noted about useful life of a tensile canopy

May not be the best solution for this project

Additional points were noted with regard to design for deck coverage:

- Deck space should be protected from weather for scheduled programming activities
- Columns should not interfere with programming
- Furniture should be lightweight and movable
- Northern corner will be a prime location, the central and southern sections should be covered



Deck roof coverage will continue to be evaluated in terms of three zones:

- Northern corner, overlooking Walnut Street and Highland Avenue, adjacent to game room
- Central location, near elevator lobby, across from walking track entrance
- Adjacent to fitness center

Some highlights of floor plans were noted:

- Entrance canopy has been extended
- Increases storage on 2nd floor
- Storage cubbies at entrance to walking track

Additional points were noted as points for consideration:

The City would consider incorporating a solar car port to help bring the building closer to net zero.

The intent of the Design Review Committee (DRC) meeting tomorrow evening, 10/13, is to ensure the design in moving in the right direction and that it is still representative of the building program.

A presentation will need to be distributed by the Friday, 10/15, in preparation for the Commission on Disability (COD) meeting next Monday, 10/18. In anticipation of an elevator discussion BH+A noted that many similarly programmed buildings have one elevator particularly senior center facilities in Needham, Falmouth and Randolph, all designed by BH+A. It was noted that the type of traction elevator is very dependable and if needed, maintenance can done during off hours. It was noted that a second elevator would increase cost and take up valuable SF. Documentation in support of one elevator will be prepared as part of the upcoming COD presentation.
