Josh Morse opened the online Zoom meeting at 9:30AM.

The intent of the meeting today is to continue to review and prepare the presentation for the February 17th Community Update meeting.

It was noted that the overwhelming majority of the Commission on Disability (COD) supports new construction. COD members voted last night in favor of submitting a letter to the Newton Historic Commission (NHC) in support of new construction.

A DRC meeting scheduled tomorrow evening, 2/16, at 7:30PM. NewCAL will not be presented at this meeting however Public Buildings will provide a brief verbal update regarding recent progress and developments. The DRC agreed to vote to submit a letter to the NHC regarding the landmarking issue which is in line with the Committee vote which unanimously approved new construction.

Josh noted 360 folks have registered for the NewCAL Community Update meeting this Thursday evening. Speakers will be asked to be concise, with a time limit of two minutes/speaker to allow everyone who wants to speak the opportunity to do so.

The presentation was reviewed in preparation for the meeting.

#### Discussion Points are Noted as Follows:

- Josh prepared a document with the NewCAL Milestone Project History as a recap of the process and progress over the past four years. This document will be emailed today to everyone who registered for the 2/17 Community meeting as well as to the project listserv.
- It was noted that there seems to be misinformation on both sides in terms of the new building entry/access as well as the addition to the rear of the existing building in the add/reno scheme. It is important to make sure the primary entrance is accessible for all visitors.
- The term "gable" (vs. "pediment") is a more familiar term and should be used during the presentation. Professional terminologies which require explanations should be avoided such as spandrel, fenestration, and corbelling.
- The roof plan should show the gable roof option.
- Roof design options need informal names, for reference and comparison. For the presentation, names will be "Gable" and "Pyramidal".
- The comparison of the two options: Gable vs. Pyramidal shall be shown as a side-by-side format.
- Slate would not be the roofing material of choice, given the cost.
- Important to note location of salvaged elements is still being explored.
- A stepped roof will help bring down scale of the building. The massing along Walnut Street will be reduced with the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor deck exposed. This stepped roof option will be studied further to be presented at a future meeting, depending on results of the roof option comparison on Thursday.

Josh Morse will provide a brief introduction, followed by Jayne Colino who will talk about the goal of "age friendly" and Jini Fairly who will speak to the importance of MAAB, ADA and Universal Design.

- Floor Plans (highlight updates made since the last meeting including adjustment to the main entrance and 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> floor overview). Approach to the entrance, parking and drop off should be noted.
- Perspectives Street view from the corner of Highland and Walnut, Pedestrian view from north, Pedestrian view from south
- Elevations all four
- Reference to historic elements and design homage (including railings, panels, stained-glass, and notable distinct features form the existing building)
- BH+A experience regarding senior centers and historic restoration.

Gable and Pyramidal options at the east elevation presented side-by-side; Feedback requested in response to which option is preferred for further study and refinement.
